4	SENATOR MICHAEL F. NOZZOLIO, CO-CHAIR,
5	NEW YORK STATE LEGISLATIVE TASK FORCE ON
6	DEMOGRAPHIC RESEARCH AND REAPPORTIONMENT: Good
7	morning. Good morning. The meeting of the New
8	York State Legislative Task Force on Demographic
9	Research and Reapportionment will come to order.
10	My name is Mike Nozzolio. I am the
11	Senate Co-chair of this task force along with my
12	colleague and dear friend Assemblyman Jack
13	McEneny. This meeting is an important one.
14	Without further ado, I would like to introduce
15	the Senate representatives on this task force.
16	To my immediate left is Senator Martin Dilan. To
17	his left is our citizen representative on the
18	task force, Welquis Ray Lopez.
19	WELQUIS LOPEZ, NEW YORK STATE
20	LEGISLATIVE TASK FORCE ON DEMOGRAPHIC RESEARCH
21	AND REAPPORTIONMENT: Thank you.
22	SENATOR NOZZOLIO: And to his left is
23	co-executive director of the task force Debra
24	Levine.

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2	Assemblyman, would you be so kind as to
3	introduce the assembly
4	ASSEMBLY MEMBER JOHN J. MCENENY, CO-
5	CHAIR, NEW YORK STATE LEGISLATIVE TASK FORCE ON
б	DEMOGRAPHIC RESEARCH AND REAPPORTIONMENT:
7	Assemblyman Jack McEneny, Co-Chair. I'm
8	representing the assembly. To my right, Bob
9	Oaks. Member of the Assembly representing the
10	minority in the assembly. To his right, Dr.
11	Roman Hedges who is the citizen representative on
12	the task force.
13	SENATOR NOZZOLIO: This task force has an
14	important responsibility, an obligation today.
15	It's a culmination of over 23 hearings in every
16	area of New York State, a plan that has been
17	proposed and proffered, and before consideration
18	I'd ask members of the task force if they have
19	any comments. Senator Dilan.
20	SENATOR MARTIN M. DILAN, NEW YORK STATE
21	LEGISLATIVE TASK FORCE ON DEMOGRAPHIC RESEARCH
22	AND REAPPORTIONMENT: Good morning, everyone.
23	I'd just like to make several comments. First of
24	all, I was seriously considering boycotting this

I know that we did hold 23 hearings throughout the state of New York. 3 We had several business meetings where we did make 4 5 several commitments to the citizens of the state of New York, and the reason I was considering 6 7 boycotting this meeting this morning is because as I indicated once before, the entire process 8 9 has been a farce, a sham, has been a waste of money, and I believe that we have not listened to 10 11 the citizens of the state of New York, and the 12 plan that's being presented today to the 13 Legislature is something that's putting the cart 14 These bills were introduced at before the horse. 15 about 11:50 p.m., just before midnight on Sunday. 16 Those bills were presented to the Legislature 17 without this panel taking a vote or making any sort of recommendation, so it's really not a - -18 19 Those bills that are being voted in both plan. 20 houses today are McEneny Nozzoilo Bill, LES - -21 Silver Bills, and this entire process I indicated 2.2 was a total waste of time and it's--we failed 23 miserably in our mission and this meeting today 24 is itself a sham. The proposed lines were

Page 7 Legislative Redistricting Recommendation, 3-14-2012 1 2 introduced. The first proposals were introduced 3 to the public without a vote by this panel. 4 Again, legislation was presented without a vote 5 by this panel. With respect to the Senate, an additional seat was added without any action 6 7 taken by this panel. So, who decided that there should be a 63rd seat? We didn't do that. Ι 8 9 would like to know that. I understand also that with these lines there may be a proposal for 10 11 reforming this entire process. When will there hearings to have community input with respect to 12 those reforms -- so, in essence, what we're doing 13 14 here today is just confirming what the two 15 leaders of respective Houses want with no real 16 input from communities of interest. I think we 17 heard people in Long Island indicate that there could be an additional minority seat in the 18 Senate out in Long Island. There could be 19 20 another one in Rochester, and there is also the 21 splitting of Niagra and Buffalo in Erie County, 22 and again, the entire process is a total waste of 23 time.

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SENATOR NOZZOLIO: Thank you, Senator

Page 8 Legislative Redistricting Recommendation, 3-14-2012 1 2 Dilan. Any other members of the task force wish 3 to make a statement? I do wish to respond in 4 part to Senator Dilan's comments. That I 5 certainly have enjoyed working with him through the past few months, in hearing from citizens all 6 7 across the state. The measure proffered today is in full 8 9 compliance with the United States' Constitution, the New York State Constitution, the Federal 10 11 Voting Rights Act, and all applicable state law that--including the law that was thrust upon this 12 13 task force on the prison counting, and I should 14 add, that measure was established in the New York 15 State Senate without so much as a single whisper 16 of a hearing. Senator Dilan, I may remind you of 17 Unfortunately, though, the law is the law, that. 18 regardless, and we took great steps and I want to 19 personally thank - - members of the Task Force. 20 A member of the Task Force, Roman Hedges, for his 21 leadership and support and assistance in ensuring 2.2 that the Section 20 of the Laws of New York State 23 were fully complied with and that that prison 24 counting issue was part of the series of laws

There is a new Asian seat created, an 3 4 Asian minority majority seat created in the State 5 Senate--the first time in the Senate's history. That seat was a direct reflection of a number of 6 7 discussions, primarily in the public hearings that took place twice in Queens. There were over 8 9 approximately ten hours of hearings in Queens and then the Asian-American seat created was created 10 11 as a result of those discussions. There are also 12 13 minority majority districts in this state. 13 Five of those districts were under the major --14 minority majority numbers as a result of the 2010 15 United States Census, and I'm very pleased through the work of this task force that every 16 17 minority district was not only preserved but strengthened in spite of shifting population 18 19 trends within the city of New York. 20 There are a number of other comments I 21 could make, but I want to make the task force for 2.2 their work, particularly the staff. That there were a number of advertisements that existed 23

prior to the first round of hearings and prior to

Those advertisements were placed in foreign language 3 4 newspaper including Chinese, Korean, and Spanish. 5 With newspapers also utilized by the African American and Indo-Caribbean American communities 6 7 throughout New York publicizing the hearings and trying to ensure maximum participation. For the 8 9 first time in our State's history, LATFOR established a website, and use of the internet 10 11 was extensive. That we took comment, posted 12 notice of public hearing and had a great deal of 13 input as a result of that website. Without 14 further ado, though, Assemblyman McEneny. 15 ASSEMBLY MEMBER MCENENY: Thank you, 16 I wanted to thank the members of the Senator. 17 LATFOR staff, and when we get to the floor, I'll mention some of the staff that have backed us up 18 19 as well as the members here, and I would just 20 point out that for people who feel that this 21 process was dragged out, that in fact we are 2.2 weeks ahead of approving of a legislative plan 23 and months ahead of approving a congressional

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plan compared to years gone by, and the reason

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Page 11 Legislative Redistricting Recommendation, 3-14-2012 1 2 for that is that the change has not been in the 3 performance of LATFOR in terms of the calendar, 4 but rather the changing of the calendar as 5 ordered by the justice department. We don't have the time that we've had in the past, and I think 6 7 our job now--and I know this will be debated in greater detail because our job now is to take the 8 9 work, which is the latest work and the final work of LATFOR and pass it on for recommendation by 10 11 consideration by the two Houses of the 12 legislature, and so unless someone else wishes to 13 make a comment. Did you ...? 14 ROMAN HEDGES, NEW YORK STATE LEGISLATIVE 15 TASK FORCE ON DEMOGRAPHIC RESEARCH AND 16 Just in the way of information REAPPORTIONMENT: 17 about things that we've done, I'm real pleased about the prison adjustment and I want to thank 18 19 all of you for helping in that. The staff--the 20 joint staff in particular was just 21 extraordinarily helpful all the way through. 22 Both the cartographic staff headed by Chris Ruiz 23 [phonetic] and the demographic staff headed by 24 Isaac Pheffer [phonetic] did just a great job.

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2	On substance, in the assembly side of the
3	proposal that's going to the legislature we were
4	able to create three additional majority Hispanic
5	districts, one additional African-American
б	district, two additional Asian-American
7	districts, and I think that that's a remarkable
8	accomplishment, and I'm particularly pleased
9	about that, and with that having been said, I
10	think I'm finished for the day.
11	SENATOR NOZZOLIO: Thank you very much,
12	Assemblyman. I would remiss if I didn't also
13	thank our other citizen representative on the
14	task force. Welquis Ray Lopez was invaluable
15	throughout this process, even acted as
16	interpreter during some of our hearings. We
17	appreciate his efforts and call above and beyond
18	the call of duty and thank you very much for your
19	great work.
20	MR. WELQUIS LOPEZ: Thank you very much.
21	SENATOR DILAN: May I move that the
22	final report of LATFOR be advance to the
23	legislature for its consideration?
24	SENATOR NOZZOLIO: There's a motion on

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2	consideration. Is there a second?
3	ASSEMBLY MEMBER MCENENY: Second.
4	SENATOR NOZZOLIO: Motion's been moved
5	and seconded. It's up for consideration.
6	Senator Dilan.
7	SENATOR DILAN: Is anything in writing
8	that you're presenting us today in terms of what
9	you're actually submitting to the legislature or
10	can you at least give us an outline of what
11	you're talking about?
12	SENATOR NOZZOLIO: It's the books that
13	have been distributed to all the members and
14	there are extra copies I believe on the desk to
15	the members.
16	SENATOR DILAN: So, the only thing that
17	you're forwarding to legislature is the Assembly
18	and Senate lines, nothing else?
19	SENATOR NOZZOLIO: At this time, that's
20	all I believe the law requires.
21	SENATOR DILAN: All right. Thank you.
22	SENATOR NOZZOLIO: Thank you, Senator
23	Dilan. This motion for consideration has been
24	seconded. All those in favor?

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2	ASSEMBLY MEMBER MCENENY: Aye.
3	SENATOR NOZZOLIO: Aye. Opposed?
4	SENATOR DILAN: Aye.
5	SENATOR NOZZOLIO: Senator Dilan.
6	Motion's carried. The work of the task force has
