WASHINGTON — The No. 2 U.S. commander in Afghanistan said Wednesday that U.S. military advisory teams will start deploying to Afghanistan this year to help Afghan combat forces as they take a more prominent role in fighting the Taliban.

Defense Secretary Leon Panetta said last week that 2013 will be a decisive year in the transition to Afghan responsibility for the war. He said he hopes that as early as mid-2013, U.S. forces will shift from lead combat role to a support

Army Lt. Col. Daniel Davis accused U.S. military leaders of misleading the public by overstating the degree of progress toward stabilizing Afghanistan.

Davis, who said he spent 12 months in Afghanistan as part of a team assessing troops' needs and circumstances, wrote that he "witnessed the absence of success on virtually every case in which someone 'who promised that Egypt will receive a lot of money,' but two months later 'none of these promises have come through.'"

He hinted that the U.S. and Arab allies are withholding aid money because Egypt has adopted more independent policies.



Egypt, US talk about crackdown

Against a backdrop of protests, relations between the two allies are strained.

Cairo — The United States' top general discussed an Egyptian crackdown on Western-funded pro-democracy groups with the head of the country's ruling military council on Saturday in a private session.

Also on Saturday, two more foreigners were arrested on charges of fomenting discontent on the first anniversary of Hosni Mubarak's ouster.

The meeting between Gen. Martin Dempsey, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, and Field Marshal Hussein Tantawi took place as relations between the two allies have reached their lowest level in decades.

Egypt, which regularly blames anti-military protests on foreign meddling, has referred 16 American civil society employees to trial on charges of using State Department money to finance unrest in Egypt. Among those referred to trial is Sam LaHood, the head of the Egypt office of the Washington-based International Republican Institute and the son of U.S. Transportation Secretary Ray LaHood.

And in an indication that authorities continue to insist that foreigners are stirring up trouble, Egyptian police said they had arrested an Australian journalist and an American student they say residents accused of trying to bribe people to join a strike aimed at pressuring military rulers to transfer power to civilian rule.

The new arrests follow warnings from both the White House and Congress that the

United States could cut an annual \$1.5 billion aid package to Egypt over the crackdown on the civil society groups.

A security official, who spoke on condition of anonymity, said the U.S. student enrolled at the American University in Cairo and the Australian journalist, along with their Egyptian guide, who also was arrested, would be interrogated by the state prosecutor.

The official did not identify the three, but a woman identified as Aliya Alwi wrote on her Twitter account that she and the two others, freelance journalist Austin Mackell and student Derek Ludovici, had been detained and told they would be transferred to a military intelligence office in the Nile Delta city of Tanta. Their identities could not immediately be confirmed.

great music and theater," said one mother whose children attend the Dalton School (\$39,970 a year). "It was great a decade ago and great now."

"They are outrageous," said Dana Haddad, a private admissions consultant, referring to tuition. "People don't want to put a price tag on their children's future, so they are willing to pay more than many of them can afford."

Administrators at several of New York's top schools attributed the tuition inflation to rising teacher salaries, ever-expanding programs and renovations to aging buildings. They noted that tuition still covered only about 80 percent of the cost of educating each child (that is what all the hand-raising is about). As at most companies, a majority of the costs — and the fastest-growing increases — come from salaries and benefits, especially as notoriously low-paying private schools try to compete with public school compensation.

"Some New York schools have had a 5, 6, or as high as 30 percent increase in the cost of their medical plans," said Mark Loria, the executive director of the New York State Association of Independent Schools.

And paying teachers is only a piece of the puzzle. Léman Manhattan Preparatory School has a gym whose floor is cleaned twice a day. The Trinity School has three theaters, six art studios, two tennis courts, a pool and a Christopher Reeve outdoor theater.

But if the pool is six, seven, or eight deep for applications for preschool — that's way higher than for maybe 20 colleges in the whole country — there is no perceived need not to increase it."

For their money, students often get exotic offerings. At Poly Prep, with 983 students on two campuses in Brooklyn, there are five sections of Level I Mandarin. Dalton offers Zen Dance; Saint Ann's has Business Travel Writing; and at Columbia Grammar, there is a theater class on "The Plague of Revenge." Classes are small, teachers often have Ph.D.'s, and most graduates are aimed at equally top-tier colleges.

But even a school with no track record can charge a boatload of money. Averara, the for-profit start-up school set to open in Chelsea in September, will charge \$39,750 starting in nursery school, which might make it the most expensive preschool in the city. (The school will offer bilingual classes and a larger school day than most early-childhood programs.)

And at some schools, there are fees on top of tuition. At Spence (\$37,600) parents pay extra for Parents Association dues (\$35) and a registration fee (\$75) and class dues (\$25 to \$50 depending on grade), while at Friends Seminary, there are additional fees

Offering Mandarin is a way to prepare students for the 21st-century world we live in," said John Altman, Trinity's headmaster. Also unlike New York public schools, which are required to be in session 180 days a year, private schools set their own schedules. At Horace Mann, where the parents of kindergartners are paying \$37,695 with additional fees, the children attend 185 days last year. For those doing the math, that's \$213 a day.

And John Fraser, a conservation psychologist with New Knowledge Organization, a New York City-based think tank, said creatures whose chemistry is modified to change behavior, and others that have been bioengineered could be among zoo inhabitants of the future. "It will be possible for us to have a semi-organic, robotic life form that has the ability to use common reasoning," Fraser said.

Those implications, like many other issues, were rigorously debated.

Noonan said in conclusion that the symposium was the start of a longer conversation about the future of zoos.

Gwen Howard, senior project manager at Foit Albert Associates, said she found the presentations and panel discussions stimulating and valuable for her own work.

"As we continue to work on new exhibits at the Buffalo Zoo, it really helped to look at these critical issues in planning exhibits that will be compelling, not just today, but for the next generation," Howard said.





Young to 'float' possibility of adding swim teams

MECHANICVILLE — A veteran teacher is laying plans for the possible start of boys and girls swim teams in the Mechanicville school district. The new competitive teams would have to start as a club sport according to Bob Young, a longtime educator in the district who has spent weeks developing the particulars for how the teams would get off the ground. If Young is successful, the swim teams would become the latest addition to a robust athletic schedule in the southern Saratoga County school district that already includes such winter sports as bowling and basketball.

Young has been working on a proposal to develop an expanded Aquatics Program for Mechanicville that would take full advantage of the district's pool which was renovated several years ago. His efforts have already led to the start of a swimming program that is listed on the school district's website under "Athletics" and he is hopeful that next school year will see the start of competitive swimming teams that will be open to high school students throughout the district.

"I am hoping that the school board will

give us the approval we need to move toward starting swim teams for both boys and girls in Mechanicville," said Young. "It would give us an opportunity to fully utilize the pool and all of the work that went into it." Before an official swim team could be put in the pool it would be necessary for it to start as what is known as a "club sport."

Such a team would have to be approved by the district's administration and would have its own faculty advisor. However the expenses related to the team — such as the cost of transportation to away meets — would be paid for by those students who are participating. School systems often use club sports as a way of gauging student interest in a new activity. Doing so keeps taxpayer funds from being used to support the team.

Among the advantages that would come from Mechanicville having swim teams would be student access to the scholarships colleges offer to those participating in competitive swimming. Young noted that many large universities compete nationally for both individual and team swimming championships. Since the district already has a modern swimming pool on its grounds, the cost of adding competitive swim teams to its existing athletic program would be minimal, according to Young.

新導彈上身 殲11B更犀利

美國「環球戰略網」日前刊登文章稱，中國殲11B戰機是美國空軍「難以琢磨的對手」。前不久有照片顯示，該機翼下掛載了一種全新空對空導彈。分析認為，該導彈具備抗衡美軍同類裝備的實力，能確保殲11B在格鬥空戰中輕鬆擊落對手。

殲11B評價

- 採用國產新型火控雷達，據估計可同時探測20個目標，並同時攻擊其中的6個目標；
- 新安裝了一個聚外波導彈逼近預警系統，兩個感測器安裝兩邊的尾翼；

- 前視紅外線探測系統具備了自我檢測/修復系統項目。

● 延續了歐式戰機的特徵，機體壽命不長、故障率高、維修較難等；

根據文章的描述，最近出現在殲11B上的新導彈代號「霹靂-10」，重約800公斤，長3米，直徑0.16米。採用先進的紅外成像制導，能分辨其正視的敵機和假目標誘餌，還可由飛行員駕駛的頭盔顯示具控制對射，實現「看哪打哪」。不僅如此，為有效打擊高機動性目標，該導彈採用了推力向量技術，具有極高的使用靈活性。「霹靂-10」的性能與美國最先進的「響尾蛇」AIM-9X導彈不相上下，是一種非常致命的武器。以各種現代戰機而言，在空戰時幾乎沒有能擺脫它的鎖定。」美媒對「霹靂-10」的出現表示「從速」，認為這種導彈將大大提升中國空軍的作戰能力，對美國空軍和太平洋空軍構成嚴重挑戰。

最近進一步補充說，「霹靂-10」導彈的「11B」是中國在許可生產的俄製蘇-27S戰機基礎上發展起來的，從整個研發過程看，中國在殲11B身上傾注了大量心血，不僅在心思還動用家底來進行優化，還從國內調集了大量的電子、機載武器以及新材料產業對其實施多項改造，力求使該機擺脫「蘇-27」的印像。

「隱形版殲11B正開發」

美國「環球戰略網」一直關注中國殲11B。2011年9月還稱，中國似乎正在大規模生產殲11B戰機，而且在同盟國形成。

據稱，原版殲11戰機於1998年服役，但是該機生產較慢，只造了100架。中國對過時的俄製電子設備性能感到失望。之後，建造了至少100架至33架的殲11A戰機。該型戰機配備有現代化國產電子設備，能使用多達8噸的雷達制導空對空導彈和智能導彈。殲11B戰機大小與殲11A相同，但配備有一款威力更強的有

源電子探測雷達(AESA)，是專門為執行對地攻擊任務設計的，戰鬥時擁有空中作戰能力。每架使用的一款新雷達探測11B戰機，即殲11B戰機。據介紹，此外，中國還在研發一款殲11戰機的雙座版本，與美軍F-15E戰機相似。基本上，該機型機體16將會是一款雙座殲11B戰機，另外還有三款隱形版殲11B戰機，即殲17，其內部彈艙，以及形狀上的改變，使該機在雷達上的可視度較低。目前大約有200架殲11B戰機正在服役，其中約40%是殲11B戰機。

지난해 3분기 애플을 제치고 스마트폰 판매 1위 업체로 떠올랐던 삼성이 석 달 만에 선두 자리를 내줬다.

27일 시장조사기관 SA(Strategy Analytics)에 따르면 애플은 지난 분기 아이폰 4S의 판매 증가에 힘입어 삼성을 제치고 스마트폰 판매 1위 자리를 되찾았다.





 the rich lifestyles of McGinn and Smith.

An estimated hundreds of investors were victims of the alleged scheme, including some who lost their life's savings, U.S. Attorney Richard S. Hartunian said Thursday. He said the indictment handed up Thursday by a federal grand jury followed a two-year investigation by the Internal Revenue Service and FBI.

"The victims of this fraudulent scheme run the spectrum of walkers ... they come from all walks of life," Hartunian said. Many, he added, "were nothing more than a bill of goods."

The indictment accuses McGinn and Smith, who are longtime friends and business partners, of personally taking nearly \$3 million from investor accounts and using the funds for country club memberships in New York, South Florida and Ireland, and to pay mortgages on expensive homes in New York and Florida. McGinn also is accused of using investors' money to pay his income taxes, make \$147,942 in alimony payments, and to help fund almost \$40,000 in expenses for thoroughbred race horses.

In one instance, McGinn and Smith are alleged to have solicited investments in connection with a \$2.4 million loan to Firstline Security Inc., an alarm contract company. "The indictment alleges that the defendants knew that Firstline was facing litigation with its dealer, but did not disclose that to investors, or tell them when Firstline filed for bankruptcy and defaulted on loans," said a statement issued by the Justice Department.

As Firstline struggled, McGinn and Smith used other investment funds to make \$2 million in "fulling payments" to the Firstline investors, prosecutors said.

"This case represents a significant step towards achieving justice for them," Hartunian said, referring to the victims. "These are difficult cases, very complex cases to investigate."

Attorneys for McGinn, 63, of

Clifton Park, and Smith, 66, of Niskayuna, could not be reached for comment. The pair have not been arrested but are scheduled to appear before U.S. Magistrate Judge Randolph F. Trece on Friday afternoon in Albany.

Monica and Peter Check, both in their mid-60s, invested with McGinn and Smith in 2009 as they retired in a small community along Florida's west coast. Monica Check, 66, who worked in a pharmaceutical company's finance office, said she lost most of her savings—\$100,000—and the couple have been financially devastated.

"We thought we were going to be vacationing one year and that's lost to us," she said. "I feel good that they finally indicted these people. ... They've taken freedom away from me."

The investigation marks the region's largest fraud case on record. It began in December 2009 after the brokerage abruptly closed and what federal regulators have described as a Ponzi-like scheme had started to unravel.

In April 2010, federal agents armed with search warrants raided the homes and offices of McGinn, Smith & Co. in New York and Florida. That same month, the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission filed a civil complaint accusing McGinn, Smith and their various investment entities of securities fraud.

federal grand jury Thursday alleges McGinn and Smith derived at least \$8 million from the proceeds of their alleged crimes. That amount includes more than \$6.3 million in fees charged to investors, of which only \$2.2 million was disclosed to those investors, prosecutors said.

"The Department of Justice and the FBI considers securities fraud of this magnitude a public threat," said Clifford C. Holly, special agent-in-charge of the FBI's Albany division.

Victor W. Lessoff, acting agent-in-charge of the IRS's New York field office, said the two agencies devoted numerous financial analysts to the investigation, which he described as nothing more than a "common fraud scheme." He said the magnitude of the scheme was devastating, though, because millions of dollars in client funds were illegally misappropriated for personal use or disguised as "loans" to McGinn and Smith in order to avoid taxes.

"From all appearances, McGinn and Smith were honest and knowledgeable," Lessoff said, adding the

pair used a series of "complex transactions" to try to hide their alleged misdeeds.

In a related civil case the Securities and Exchange Commission has accused McGinn and Smith of hiding assets when federal regulators began analyzing their brokerage several years ago. The brokerage, the SEC alleges, may have victimized up to 900 investors of \$136 million.

The criminal investigation yielded its first action in November when the brokerage's former accountant, Ronald Simmons of Binghamton, pleaded guilty to falsifying income-tax returns for David Smith and Smith's wife, Lynn Weeks later, a former senior managing partner for the brokerage, Matthew Rogers of Miami, pleaded guilty to a felony tax charge.

Rogers, who is cooperating in the investigation, is accused in the indictment of converting \$973,000 in investor funds for personal use. McGinn and Smith's assets were frozen by a federal judge and an attorney has been appointed to oversee the firm's remaining assets.

Assistant U.S. Attorneys Elizabeth C. Coombe and Richard D. Bellis are prosecuting the case.

Why is investment income taxed less?

WASHINGTON — Why do Mitt Romney and other wealthy investors pay lower taxes on the income they make from investments than they would if they earned their money from wages? Because Congress, through the tax code, has long treated investment more favorably than labor, seeing it as an engine for economic growth.

President Barack Obama and the Occupy Wall Street movement are challenging that value system, raising volatile election-year issues of equity, fairness—and Romney's tax returns.

Romney, who released his 2010 and 2011 tax returns this week, has been forced to defend the fact that he paid a tax rate of about 15 percent on an annual income of \$21 million. His tax rate is comparable to the one paid by most middle-income families. His income, however, is 420 times higher than the typical U.S. household.

The Republican presidential

candidate's taxes were so low because the vast majority of his income came from investments. The U.S. has long had a progressive income tax, in which people who make more money pay taxes at a higher rate than those who make less. But for almost as long, the U.S. has taxed capital gains—the profit from selling an investment—at a lower rate than wages.

William McBride, an economist at the conservative Tax Foundation, says it is unfair to tax income more than once, and capital gains are taxed multiple times. If you got the original investment from wages, that money was taxed. If the stock you own gains value because the company you invested in makes a profit, those profits are taxed through the corporate tax.

But many people are double taxed, says Chuck Marr, director of federal tax policy for the liberal Center on Budget and Policy Priorities. He adds: "Check out your last pay stub. There's income tax and payroll tax, so you're double taxed, too."

that when the answer is almost uniformly, "We are still studying it?" DeFrancisco said.

"This is the start of the dialogue," McDonald replied.

To be sure, this year's transportation plans are different from those in the past. Among the highlights, a plan to finally tackle replacement of the aging Tappan Zee Bridge, which spans the Hudson River between Rockland and Westchester counties, and consolidation of DOT's 11 statewide regions into six.

Details about how to pay for the \$5 billion bridge are far from finished; the state has only recently

settled on a financial advisory firm to help in the process.

And the consolidation plans are also in flux, with no settled plans on which offices might be closed or merged.

Following Thursday's hearings, McDonald acknowledged the merger was a departure but said it should help make the agency operate more efficiently.

"I am looking at a 40-year-old organization that has always done things the way they've done it," she said. "It is 2012. It's time to look at technology. It's time to look at ways of maximizing our operations. ... You have to stand back with fresh eyes."

Later, DeFrancisco said his aim was to get a commitment for more details before lawmakers finalize the 2012-13 budget.

"She did say that she'll have them before we have to vote on the budget," he said.

Nokia profits dive as new phones slow to take off

HELSINKI — Nokia Oyj reported a 73 percent fall in fourth-quarter earnings as sales of its new Windows Phones failed to dent the dominance of Apple Inc.'s iPhone or compensate for diving sales of its own old smartphones.

The world's largest cellphone maker by volume last February unveiled a major strategy shift to Microsoft Corp software for its smartphones in an attempt to challenge Apple and Google Inc.'s Android. But Apple's phones in particular have proved far more popular.

Apple reported earlier this week sales of 37 million iPhones for the December quarter. Nokia has sold over 1 million Windows Phones since its launch in mid-November.

"It is more than some were expecting, but it's not going to worry Apple or Google," said

analyst Nick Dillon from research firm Ovum.

Nokia said it expects its phone business' underlying earnings to be around breakeven in the first quarter, well below analysts forecasts, with sales falling more than usual in the seasonally weaker quarter.

"The report highlights that the start of the Windows strategy is slow, and we have very little concrete data to predict its success at this point," said analyst Michael Schroder from FIM Securities.

"There are a lot of uncertainties. These are critical times for the future of the whole company. The next months will be extremely important."

Ben Wood, head of research at mobile consultancy CCS Insight, compared Nokia to a late starter in a marathon, saying it needs to move fast.

"The reality is that it's going to have to be an exceptionally fast marathon if it wants narrow the gap with its

rivals," he said.

Nokia's fourth-quarter core earnings per share of 0.06 euro were better than the market's expectation for 0.04 euro. The results were boosted by a \$250 million payment from Microsoft as part of the Windows Phone sales deal.

Microsoft has tried to enter the mobile industry for more than ten years, but with little success. Its market share is 1-2 percent. Canals analyst Pete Cunningham said Microsoft's deal with Nokia was make or break for its ambitions in this sector.

"Nokia gives Microsoft a chance to enter the big stage. If they cannot make it work, arguably this is the end of the road," he said.

The board put forward Risto Siilasmaa as its next chairman to replace long-time leader, Jorma Ollila, who is due to step down in May.

Siilasmaa, a 45-year old entrepreneur, has been a Nokia board member since 2008 and

is known in Finland as the founder of software security company F-Secure, but has a low profile outside the country.

Nokia's quarterly net loss totalled 1.1 billion euros (\$1.43 bln), or 0.29 euros per share, due to a 1.1 billion euro writedown for its digital mapping assets.

Android tablets closing in on iPad

Tablet computers using Google's Android software narrowed the lead of Apple's iPad on the global market in the fourth quarter, research firm Strategy Analytics said on Thursday.

Global tablet shipments reached an all-time high of 26.8 million units in the fourth quarter, growing 2-1/2 fold from 10.7 million a

year earlier, the research firm said.

"Dozens of Android models distributed across multiple countries by numerous brands such as Amazon, Samsung, Asus and others have been driving volumes," analyst Neil Mawston said in a statement.

Android's market share rose to 39 percent

from 29 percent a year earlier, while Apple's share slipped to 58 percent from 68 percent a year before.

The tablet computer market grew 260 percent last year to 66.9 million units as consumers are increasingly buying tablets in preference to notebooks and even entry-level notebooks or desktops.


